"The Lord said to Samuel, 'How long will you grieve over Saul, since I have rejected him from being king over Israel? Fill your horn with oil, and be on your way! I will send you to Jesse the Bethlehemite, for I have provided for Myself a king among his sons.'" 1 Samuel 16:1

Anointing = Holy Spirit empowerment

Every aspect of our life-calling rises or falls on anointing. Just as Jesus fulfilled His life-calling out of His Holy Spirit anointed humanity, so everything godly in us is fulfilled according to our Holy Spirit anointing.

As Christian leaders we not only want to walk in Christ's anointing, we want to be empowered to recognize, validate, activate and empower Christ's anointing on others.

1. We don't choose whom to anoint, God does!

"I will send you to Jesse the Bethlehemite, for I have provided for Myself a king among his sons." 1 Samuel 16:1

2. Past heartaches, disappointments, and failures do not disqualify us from future opportunities.

"How long will you grieve over Saul, since I have rejected him from being over Israel?" 1 Samuel 16:1

3. To anoint God's chosen leaders we need His heart, eyes and ears.

"Do not look on his appearance or on the height of his stature, because I have rejected him. For the Lord sees not as man sees; man looks on the outward appearance, but the Lord looks on the heart." 1 Samuel 16:7

4. Anointing flows out of fullness and fullness must always be fresh.

"Fill your horn with oil..." 1 Samuel 16:1

"But you have exalted my horn like that of a wild ox; you have poured over me fresh oil." Psalm 92:10

5. Anointing to anoint others requires apostolic movement.

Since all anointing belongs to Christ, we are His stewards, only ever acting on His behalf. We must never anoint casually or haphazardly, but only at the initiative of Christ.

"Fill your horn with oil and be on your way. I will send you to Jesse the Bethlehemite, for I have provided for myself a king among his sons." 1 Samuel 16:1

The Samuel anointing is the empowerment to anoint others—to impart, activate, empower, and validate the anointing of Christ on others. The calling to anoint others is a high calling.

Not everyone has the Samuel anointing, but if you do, steward it well!
